1) Do we acknowledge our sin?

9v1: After these things had been done, the leaders came to me and said, 'The people of Israel, including the priests and the Levites, <u>have not kept themselves</u> <u>separate</u> from the neighbouring peoples with their <u>detestable practices</u>...

1) Do we acknowledge our sin?

9v2: They have taken some of their daughters as wives for themselves and their sons, and have **mingled the holy race with the peoples around them**. And the leaders and officials have led the way in this **unfaithfulness**.'

1) Do we acknowledge our sin?

Deuteronomy 7v3-4: Do not intermarry with them. Do not give your daughters to their sons or take their daughters for your sons, ⁴ for they will turn your children away from following me to serve other gods...

2) Do we mourn our sin?

Mt 5v4: Blessed are those who mourn for they shall be comforted

9v5: Then, at the evening sacrifice, I rose from my self-abasement, with my tunic and cloak torn, and <u>fell on my knees</u> with my <u>hands spread out</u> to the LORD my God ⁶ and <u>prayed</u>:

9v6: 'I am too ashamed and disgraced, my God, to lift up my face to you, because our sins are higher than our heads and our guilt has reached to the heavens...'



Luke 18v13: But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, "God, have mercy on me, a sinner."





9v8: 'But now, for a brief moment, the LORD our **God has been gracious** in leaving us a remnant and giving us a firm place in his sanctuary, and so our God gives light to our eyes and **a little relief** in our bondage.

9v14: Shall we then break your commands **again** and intermarry with the peoples who commit such detestable practices?

Have we not learned??

9v15: LORD, the God of Israel, you are righteous! We are left this day as a remnant. Here we are before you in our guilt, though because of it not one of us can stand in your presence.

To the cross we go...




Psalm 32v9: Do not be like the horse or the mule, which have no understanding but must be controlled by bit and bridle or they will not come to you.
