

Matthew 22V1-14 THE WEDDING BANQUET

V13: "Then the king told the attendants, 'Tie him hand and foot, and throw him outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

21v45-46: When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard Jesus' parables, they knew he was talking about them. ⁴⁶ They looked for a way to arrest him...

2) A Generous Invitation

V3: He sent his servants to those who <u>had</u> been invited to the banquet to tell them to come, but they refused to come.

2) A Generous Invitation

V4: "Then he sent some more servants and said, 'Tell those who have been invited that I have prepared my dinner: My oxen and fattened cattle have been butchered, and **everything is ready**. **Come** to the wedding banquet.'



2) A Generous Invitation

V14:"For many are invited, but few are chosen."

3) A Painful Refusal

V5: "But they paid no attention and went off—one to his field, another to his business."

3) A Painful Refusal

Apathy

V6: The rest seized his servants, **Hostility** mistreated them and killed them.



3) A Painful Refusal
